

Antebellum Society Dinner Party

- You are a Social Secretary for a prominent member of Antebellum Society. You will choose ten guests from our "Who's Who" of Unit 4 to invite to a dinner party. You task is to plan the guest list and seating arrangement of the guests.
- Create a diagram illustrating the type of seating you would use (ex. circular or rectangular).
- Assign each guest a seat in the diagram. You must include guests that you think would get along ("perfect matches"), as well as guests that you think would not get along ("perfect frienemies").
- Write an explanation of your seating arrangement. Why did you place certain people next to one another? Why did you place certain people away from one another? Did you identify any possible conflicts? Anything the guests might have in common?
- You will be assessed on you choices and explanations. Use specific historical information and content vocabulary to defend your arrangement.
