Who is Cornelius Vanderbilt?

This industrial leader, and author
of *The Gospel of Wealth*,
controlled the steel industry by
bringing the Bessemer process to
the U.S. and establishing a
monopoly through Vertical
Integration.

Who is Andrew Carnegie?

These booming
communities in the west
grew as people came
hoping to find gold or
silver.

What are
mining
towns?

This is formed as companies assign stocks to a board of trustees who combine them into a new, more powerful organization.

What is a trust?

This ideology refers to the idea that the value of a person is determined by how much money one had.

What is Social Darwinism?

This Sioux leader
assembled his own army to
drive settlers out.

Who is Sitting Bull?

This was the site of the
confrontation between
General Custer's 700 men
and 7000 Sioux men.

Where is Little Big Horn?

This massacre effectively
ended Native American
resistance to white
settlement of remaining
western lands.

What is the Wounded Knee Massacre?

These are the spaces
provided for the
relocation of large
groups of Native
Americans.

What are
reservations?

This was the center of a
revival movement to
strengthen the Sioux against
white settlers.

What is the Ghost Dance?

This political boss put
New York City into
millions of dollars of debt.

Who is Boss
Tweed?

This political cartoonist
and editor exposed
political corruption in New
York City.

Who is Thomas Nast?

This “corrupt bargain” ended
Reconstruction.

What is the Compromise of 1877?

He founded the American
Federation of Labor.

Who is Samuel Gompers?

This protest was ended by
President Cleveland due to
the interruption of federal
mail delivery.

What is the Pullman Strike?

This is the practice of
workers and bosses
negotiating for higher
wages and better
working conditions.

What is collective
bargaining?

This incident in 1886 began as a labor protest and escalated into a riot when someone threw a bomb at the police.

What is the Haymarket Affair?

Some employers forced
workers to sign these
agreements as a promise
not to join a union.

What are yellow dog
contracts?

She was a female
sharpshooter in a Wild
West Show.

Who is Annie Oakley?

He owned the newspaper, *The New York World*, and initiated a fundraising campaign to assemble the Statue of Liberty.

Who is Joseph Pulitzer?

This author coined the
term “Gilded Age.”

Who is Mark Twain?

This artistic style was a reaction to Romanticism and aimed to convey the real conditions of industrial life.

What is Realism?

This genre of variety shows
were a popular source of
entertainment in the cities.

What is vaudeville?
